The Best 1st year Student was Mr. Erastus Kashuupulwa.



Ministerial Briefing

The NITRP and NCTRP Board Members met with the Deputy Minister of MURD on 21 April 2016.

They briefed the Deputy Minister on:

- the objectives of the NITRP and NCTRP and upcoming events.
- deliberations that took place on the Urban and Regional Planning (URP) Bill with the legal drafters;

need to expedite the tabling of the URP Bill in the parliament to streamline planning applications and related processes;

- need for capacity development at local authorities to ensure full implementation of the URP Bill;
- problems at the City of Windhoek with slow approval of development (planning) applications; and
- Townships Board and NAMPAB ad hoc rules

that pose delays to development applications.

Dep. Min. Klazen explained the need to take the Townships Board, NAMPAB, NITRP and NCTRP board members to regions to gather inputs on broader town and regional planning issues.

He recommended that a briefing meeting between NCTRP/NITRP and the Minister of MURD be organized; thereafter the NCTRP/NITRP should meet with the Townships Board and NAMPAB to further discuss the issues raised.

Going For the Gold: When Town Planning Was an Olympic Competition

In the first half of the 20th century, the Olympic games actually had a medal competition for town planning. Along with town planning, the lineup of events also included painting, sculpture, literature and music.

Baron Pierre de Coubertin, the founder of the modern Games, believed art and architecture were a vital component for his vision of the Olympics. authors and urban planners.

The USA 's first medal at the Nazi Olympics were actually for town planning. Detailed plans for Marine Park which when complete will be the greatest municipal recreation and sports center in the world, are now on view in the Print Gallery of the Brooklyn Museum. The plans are the work of Charles D. Lay, prominent Brooklyn architect, who has incorporated ideas gleaned from recreation centers both in the US and abroad. They include a seaside park with two miles of water frontage, a large circular pond and canal for water sports, a yacht basin, a harbor for outboard motorboats, golf courses, swimming pools, athletic fields, parking spaces, a music grove, a zoo, an open air theater and a casino. There will also be a picnic grounds and a stadium seating 100,000.

Council's Contribution: The latest on the Urban and Regional Planning Bill

The Namibian Urban and Rural Planning Bill have been in the making for the past 15 years.

Hopefully the wait for its enactment is not far off as the Ministry of Urban and Rural Development has taken the lead to facilitate this.

A number of strategic stakeholder meetings have been held since May 2016 to ensure that enactment still takes place in this year. The main focus was to critically interpret and review the clauses contained in the Bill to determine the implications and practicality of the implementation thereof.

The responsibility now rests with the Ministry to ensure that the recommendations for amendments that were made are feasible and such should be synchronized with recommendations from the legal drafters.

Once this process is done, the Bill will be rectified and be forwarded to the Attorney General for its introduction to Parliament during September 2016.

It is only then that the Town and Regional Planning fraternity in Namibia would have an inkling about when the Bill would be enacted.
